Results for 2013 Rochester CBC

The Rochester Christmas bird count was held on Saturday December 14. 29 people turned out to drive and hike sections of the count circle, and reports were submitted for nine feeders. 52 species were found on the day of the count, and three additional species found within three days of the count were reported as "count week" birds.

The most unusual species were a greater white-fronted goose and a pair of rusty blackbirds spotted on the count day, and a brown thrasher found the day after. Ronald Johannsen listed a pair of fly-over swans on his feeder report. No pine siskins or red-breasted nuthatches were reported, which is unusual.

Most water was frozen, and that limited the variety of waterfowl. There was light snow in the morning, and it was cold (2 to 15 degrees F) but not bitterly cold.

Many thanks to Quarry Hill Nature Center for use of their building on the count day, to Kirk Payne for bringing a wonderful potato soup to the final potluck meal, and of course, to all participants!

First, I want to thank Grant W Volkman, Alan C Dewey, Alice Laudon, Brian T Purrington, Joel H. Dunnette and Larry W Mortensen for their generous contributions to Zumbro Valley Audubon on Give to the Max Day 2013 last November.

Second, I point out to the envelope included with your newsletter or in the case of electronic delivery a donation form.

Roughly half of the money we need to operate annually comes from your donations and only one-fifth comes from a portion of the dues paid to national Audubon.

Our two biggest expenses are the printing and mailing the newsletter and programs (room rent and speaker fees).

Other activities during the year past included taking our display (either landscaping for wildlife or neighborhood birds) to eleven events where we had contact with 500 adults and 250 children.

Several members led and participated in developing the first natural area management plan for a Rochester city park. Our efforts are helping people create more habitat in their own yards and parks.

We worked with a property owner, the town of Preston, Audubon MN, and the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources to repair and preserve a large chimney that we had documented as hosting as many as 1000 Chimney Swifts during migration in August. Also we constructed a combination informational kiosk and chimney swift breeding tower in Preston.
